Principal's message

On Monday of this week, we joined Jordan Springs Public School. JSPS is a new school 10 minutes from Penrith. It has a school population of 1,100 students. Our Year 3 students confidently joined a Year 3 class, and our Year 1 students joined another Year 1 class. We stayed overnight in a hotel before attending Pulse rehearsals the next day. The students already knew all the songs and learned which parts of each song they sing with the choir. It was a new experience to have a conductor. The students tried hard to focus on the conductor with so many interesting things to look at. Thank you to Mrs. Griffiths and Mrs. B Cathles for catering for us. We also appreciate Mrs. H Cathles for joining us as the second adult. It is a significant commitment of staff and responsibility to attend overnight excursions.

Next week, we head back to Sydney for a day of rehearsals before our big choir performance at Roswell Arena Thursday evening. I know our students will be brilliant and will love every minute of being part of such a large performance. The girls have been so well behaved and actively engaged in every opportunity. We will make the most of being in Sydney, by visiting Katoomba the day before, to see The Three Sisters and participate in the Buunyal Tour at Scenic World. The day following the performance, we will head into Sydney CBD to walk around the Royal Botanical Gardens, Opera House and view the Sydney Harbour Bridge before boarding a boat for a Harbour Cruise, to see all the points of interest in Sydney from the harbour.

We have hosted two PLC's recently. The first one was our STEM PLC and the students learnt about bushfires. We are using student's home floor plans to devise a fire plan for each family. We are also looking at our school's fire plan and learning ways to help keep us safe. Our students really enjoy this PLC with Dalton and Breadalbane schools, and we look forward to heading to Breadalbane on Wednesday 3 April to continue this learning.

Yesterday we hosted more than 60 students in our Literacy & Numeracy PLC with Bowning and Binalong PS. The students participated in three activities with students in their age group. We had an NRL led activity, STEM and representatives from Maritime Boating Education. Our school presented a spelling and leadership workshop for all the teachers while the students engaged in the activities. It was wonderful to have so many people at our school. Everyone always comments on how much they love how our school looks and feels. It makes us proud knowing how special our school is.

Last week we had the pleasure of visiting Charlie Barton at Oakey Creek. The students explored his fabulously restored slab hut to learn more about life one hundred years ago there. Charlie explained many details about family life in that period. After a wonderful play, the students then imagined the family that lived there and wrote short stories about one of the family members living in the hut. Charlie made us all a lovely sausage sandwich for lunch. Thank you to Charlie for sharing his special hut with us and helping the students extend their understanding of life in Wee Jasper many years ago.

Will Kostakis returned last month to support our writing program. He was thrilled to see the improvement in our older student's writing. Will extended how well they create an orientation (introduction) to their stories, describing their characters and setting. He also supported their understanding of the structure of a narrative. Most importantly, he continued to create a love of writing. Thank you to Helen and Tim Cathles for providing accommodation. Thank you also to Wendy Griffiths and Bridgette and Antony Cathles for catering and hosting Will for dinner.























Out and About





