STEM PLC Dalton PS

This week's challenge for our STEM teams

STEM Challenge: Powerhouse International Needs Your Help! *Can You Build a Boat That Can Brave the Seas?*

We've been contacted by Powerhouse International, a global shipping company with an urgent mission! All of their ships are currently in use, and they need our help to transport precious fine wool bales safely across the ocean.

Your task? Become engineers and designers to solve a real-world problem!

The Problem:

Powerhouse International needs a vessel that can transport materials across water safely.

X The Challenge:

Design and build a boat that can:

- Hold the required weight (e.g. wool bales or other designated classroom items),
- Float without sinking for at least two minutes, and
- Use wind power (a sail) to move across water.

▲ What Issues Could There Be?

Here are some key considerations to keep in mind during your design process:

MATERIALS.

- What materials are available?
- Are they waterproof or can they be made waterproof?
- Will they float or absorb water?

STDENGTH:

- Will your boat support the weight of everything added?
- Will it still move or become too heavy and sink?

ΔΤΤΔCHMENT

- How will you attach parts of your boat (sail, base, supports) securely?
- What adhesives or fasteners work best in wet conditions?

FLOATATION:

- What features or materials can help your vessel stay afloat?
- What elements will assist with movement through water?

SIZE:

- Is there enough space to hold the wool bales (or simulated cargo)?
- Will the boat remain balanced?

What Could You Research to Make a Better Design?

Want your boat to go the distance? Here are some ideas to guide your research:

- What materials and shapes help vessels float best?
- What boat designs are proven to be successful?
- What is the most effective sail design to catch wind?
- How can you calculate weight vs floatation to ensure success?

Are you ready to think like engineers, test your theories, and rise to the Powerhouse Challenge?
