School Uniform

Bushfire Season

As you may be aware, the bushfire season has already commenced. After consultation with the Rural Fire Service, it was advised that our safest bushfire management plan in the event of a local bushfire is to 'shelter in place.' The designated refuge within the school is C Block and the library. The identified risk to the school is the threat from possible ember attack, and it was advised that emergency services can better account for and protect students and staff while sheltering in place on site.

Late Pick Up

If you are delayed in the afternoon, please contact the school office on 9623 7077 so we can advise your child to wait for you at the office. All students not picked up on time are required to wait at the office until a parent or carer arrives.

Morning Supervision

Just a reminder that the school day does not start until 9:10 am, and morning supervision does not commence until 8:40 am. Students should not arrive before this time. Once students enter the school grounds, they must abide by school rules, including being in the correct place for morning supervision. They cannot wait outside classrooms, even if accompanied by parents. All students must be in the designated "in-bounds" areas. Thank you for helping our students be "Werrington Wise."

If you require care for your child before 8:40 am, two Out of School Hours (OoSH) care providers operate for students needing care before 8:40 am or after 3 pm.
