
What is PBL?

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole school approach that creates a positive learning environment which enables students to succeed and thrive.

PBL allows for the consistent teaching and reinforcing of expectations to support appropriate student behaviour and is based around strong use of data, systems, and practices.

How can you Support PBL?

- Talk to your children about our school expectations.
- Discuss what the expectations mean at school, at home and in the community.
- Support the school in its development of positive behaviour in students.
- Keep communication open as families have valuable insights and information about how their children learn best and what help they need.

Core Expectations

At Westdale Public School, our three core expectations are to be **Safe**, **Proud** and have **High Expectations**. Signs and mascots have been positioned around the school to remind students of our core expectations.

Positive Rewards System

We have a school wide behaviour system that recognises and encourages positive behaviour. Students receive effective positive feedback and awards when they are being safe, proud and having high expectations. We also have celebration days throughout the year to celebrate student success.

Weekly Lessons

Students participate in weekly whole school lessons that focus on a specific behaviour that is determined from data. This focus area aligns with the positive rewards system where students are acknowledged as they learn new skills and embed them into daily life at Westdale Public School.

Student Welfare and

Student Support

The NSW public education system seeks to provide quality education for all students, taking account of their age, background, ability and interests. Public schools help students to become self-directed, lifelong learners who can create a positive future for themselves and for the wider community.

For this to occur, public schools need to be places where every student can learn and grow with confidence. Students develop best in schools where teaching and learning occur in a context of student welfare.

Schools need to be safe and happy places for students and their teachers. Student welfare is enhanced when all members of the school community participate in the learning programs and life of the school.

School communities have developed their own student welfare plans and approaches. Students at Westdale Public School are given every opportunity to feel good about themselves and are encouraged to make the right decisions about expected behaviour. The Student Support Policy aims to encourage each child at Westdale Public School to be responsible for their own behaviour. Parents and staff work in partnership to achieve this goal.

Whole School Behaviour Policy:

Westdale Public School operates under a Whole School Behaviour Policy. This Policy includes consequences such as teacher intervention, lunchtime reflection, monitoring sheets, parental intervention, and behaviour slips. Children sometimes behave inappropriately because they have a problem at school or at home. We encourage you to talk to your child's teacher first, alternatively the Deputy Principal if there is something that may be causing your child to be unsettled. We offer support in these situations to you and your child. We encourage and regularly reward positive behaviour.

Students who behave in an outstanding fashion can receive various awards. The school certainly appreciates and values good behaviour.

We have in place a structured Merit System. If a child receives three coloured Westdale Awards such as Sylvia Safe Award, Percy Proud Award and Herbie High Expectations Award they can bring them to school and can "cash them in" for a school Achievement Award. Five school Achievement Awards and the student will receive a Special Award. Five Special Awards and the student will receive a Banner. Five Banners and your child will receive a Blues Award. Students who receive a Blues Award have lunch with the Principal to celebrate their outstanding success. If your child receives a Banner, then you can be extremely proud of him/her. This structured Merit System works in conjunction with our overall Student Welfare and Support System. Added recognition for well-behaved students is our Student of the Week Award.

General Information

School times: Supervision of the playground begins at 8.55am. Children who arrive before this time are to remain in the quad area. Classes start at 9.25am. Lunch 11.25am – 12.10pm. Afternoon tea 1.45pm – 2.10pm. School finishes at 3.25pm.

Permission notes: Notes are required by the school for a child to leave the school on any visit or excursion. This is a departmental requirement. A child will not be taken on an excursion without the authority of a parent or carer. All notes are returned via the Percy Post, Postbox system at school.

Attendance at school: All absences from school should be accounted for by a note, a phone call from a parent/carer to the office or by replying to the text messaging system. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is ill.

Telephone: The school phone number is 02 6760 7219. Messages for students need to be called to the office before 1.30pm each day. Teachers are not able to take phone calls during lessons. The school fax number is 02 6760 7469.

Name tags/lost property: Please ensure all clothing and property is clearly marked with your child's name. Lost property goes into a lost property box, which is located outside the main office block

Immunisation: Immunisation certificates need to be presented with the completed school enrolment form.

Library Books: A water resistant bag is required for children to borrow library books. These are used to protect the books. Children may borrow each week if previous books have been returned. **Scripture:** Anglican and Catholic Scripture Teachers visit the school every Thursday from 12.15pm to 12.45pm and children attend classes for twenty-five minutes according to their religion nominated on the enrolment form. Children who do not attend Scripture participate in Australian Curriculum Values lessons.

Jewellery: Children should not wear jewellery to school as it can get lost or broken and cause many unnecessary problems and sometimes accidents. (Medical bracelets are acceptable). Children who have earrings should only wear studs to school.

Bus Travel: All children travelling by bus need a bus pass. Applications are made online, and information is available at the office.

Change of routines: For all students K-2, a phone call is required informing the class teacher of any change in travel arrangements. Young children can confuse messages about travel instructions. If children have appointments during the school day, parents are requested to go to the office and collect a leave slip before collecting the child. For safety reasons we cannot permit children to wait at the school gate for parents to collect them during school hours.

School reports: Students from Kindergarten to Year 6 take home a Progress Report twice a year at the end of terms 2 and 4. However, you are encouraged to make an appointment at any time during the year if you have questions or concerns about your child's progress.

Canteen: The Canteen operates five days per week for lunch and afternoon tea and is always appreciative of volunteer helpers. ALL canteen orders need to be made via the Flexischools app, and need to be ordered before 9.00am each day. There are no cash sales for lunch or afternoon tea at the canteen.

Voluntary School Contribution: Parents can make a voluntary contribution. The school have set the Voluntary School Contribution at \$10 per student per term. The proceeds of these contributions are used to assist with school resources.

Sickness: Children who become sick or have an accident at school are sent to Sick Bay and parents are contacted. As we believe children cannot learn when they are ill, please do not send them to school if they are sick. When you enrol your child, we ask you to provide an emergency contact

person and phone number. It is important that you keep this information current, so that we can contact you in case of an emergency. **Please note:** You must provide an immunisation certificate before children come to school. Any child not immunised has to be sent home at the outbreak of diseases e.g. German measles.

Prescribed Medication: If it is necessary for children to take prescribed medication during school hours, written authorisation for staff to administer the medication must be received from parents or guardians. An authorisation form can be obtained from the office. A letter from the doctor is also required outlining the medical condition and the information regarding the medication. Medication should be delivered in a clearly labelled and securely fastened container. ONLY MEDICATION IN THE CHILD'S NAME WILL BE ADMINISTERED TO THAT CHILD.

Uniform Standards: At Westdale Public School we have high expectations for uniform and for the standards, which should be set. It is expected that <u>all children</u> will wear the correct uniform <u>every day</u>. This includes the correct shoes. Children feel special and important when they are dressed well. We encourage families to send children to school in a neat and tidy manner. We all need to work together to ensure that children are always presented with pride.

Uniform Sales: All school uniform items can be purchased from Lowes in Peel Street, Tamworth. **School Hats:** We are a "NO HAT STAY IN THE SHADE" school. Red hats are available to purchase at Lowes. All children must wear a hat every day at school. Caps and other hats are not to be worn to and from school.
