North Coast Athletics

Congratulations to Hudson and to our junior girls relay team for qualifying to represent Westlawn PS and the North Coast at the upcoming NSWPSSA State Athletics Championships. Competitors needed to finish in the first three to advance to the state carnival.

Hudson continued his blistering form finishing 2nd in the 10 years boys 100m in a time of 14.32s and 3rd in the junior boys 200m with a time of 31.81s. Our junior girls relay team of Piper, Alice, Lola and Gracie ran a super race to finish 3rd place in their final in 1.05.21.

Fantastic results on the day were also recorded by our junior boys relay team of Ashton, Hudson, Knox and Brodie finishing 4th in the final in 1.01.14, just missing state qualification. Maya finished 6th in 11years girls 100m after an extremely close finish with only 0.4 of one second separating the first six runners. Maya's time was 14.84s. She also finished 12th in long jump with 3.50m. Landen grabbed 7th in the junior boys discus throwing 20.18m. Jacob finished 9th in the junior boys 800m in 2.54.84 and 10th in the junior boys 1500m in 5.51.45. Our senior girls relay team of Ashlynn, Maya, Makella, and Hollie finished 7th in their heat in 1.01.10.
