# WORLD OF MATHS PROBLEM SOLVING DAY 2025: MAKING MATHS MEANINGFUL FOR YEARS 7–9

What is World of Maths? World of Maths is a travelling problem-solving program that immerses students in the practical side of mathematics. With a variety of puzzles, games, and team challenges, the day encourages students to explore, collaborate, and think creatively—demonstrating that maths is far more than just a textbook subject.

Why It Matters - This program helps students build connections between classroom content and real-world application. By tackling rich, open-ended problems, students develop persistence, problem-solving strategies, and critical thinking skills—all key to success in maths and beyond.

Learning Through Doing - A standout feature of the day was the use of concrete materials and interactive setups, allowing students to physically engage with the mathematics. Whether they were constructing shapes, navigating puzzles, or solving spatial challenges, students were learning through doing—and having a great time doing it!


