## A message from Principal Mrs Bugeja

As we start a new term, I extend a warm welcome to students and families who have recently arrived at Willmot Public School and an enthusiastic welcome back to school to all Willmotians!

### Student Survey Results

I am happy to share results from the recent NSW Public Schools Survey, where 75 of our students from Years 3 to 6 took part. This survey helps us understand how our students feel about their school experience and how we can improve.

I am proud to tell you that our school has done very well in several important areas:

- **Explicit Teaching:** 93% of our students said that their teachers use clear teaching methods. This helps them understand their lessons better and is part of our plan to support great teaching.
- **High Expectations:** Again, 93% of students feel that their teachers have high expectations for them. This encourages our students to do their best and reach their goals.
- **Classroom Management:** 91% of students reported that their classrooms are well-managed. This means our teachers set clear rules and create calm places for learning.
- **Motivation and Engagement:** We saw that 85% of students feel motivated and 88% feel engaged in their learning. This shows we are providing enjoyable and effective learning experiences.
- **Sense of Belonging:** A fantastic 93% of our students feel they belong at our school, which is a 7% increase from last year. This result validates the work we have been doing to lift our school identity, foster supportive relationships with students and prioritise student voice in our planning.

While these results are very positive, we know there is work to do. This year, 38% of students reported experiencing bullying behaviours. This is lower than the 48% in other similar schools and 40% across the state, which is a step in the right direction. We take bullying very seriously and are committed to improving our strategies to keep all students safe and supported. About 69% of students strongly agree that our school deals fairly with bullying reports. We will continue to work with our student leaders to gather more feedback and make our approaches even better.

These positive results connect to our focus on professional learning for teachers and the goals in our school improvement plan. We are dedicated to making sure our students succeed and feel valued in their learning environment.

### Feedback on 'Kiss n Drop'

I want to thank parents and carers for sharing their thoughts about the new "Kiss n Drop" procedures we introduced this year. Your feedback is very important in helping us create a positive and easy school experience for everyone.

We received 12 responses to our survey, and I'm pleased to see that 66% said they liked the new routine. Many parents said their children have settled in well, enjoying the quicker drop-off and pick-up times. It's great to hear that "Kiss n Drop" has helped make our school calmer at the beginning and end of the day. Most families feel comfortable coming to the canteen and office in the mornings. 25% were unsure about this, and we would like to reassure you that you are welcome to access the canteen and office before school when you need to.

We also want to acknowledge some concerns that were raised. Some parents mentioned they miss the informal chats with teachers that used to happen during drop-off and pick-up. In response, teachers from each stage have been scheduled to be available to have a chat on Wednesday mornings at breakfast. We appreciate the feedback and will continue to work on ways to increase opportunities for communication. Your suggestions are always welcome.

### Connecting you with learning

In the past, we trialled sending text messages to share information about your child's learning. You might remember receiving messages about new words, maths topics, or science lessons. Your feedback showed us that you would like to get these messages regularly.

This term, we will send you a text message every week. We will share information about our weekly PDHPE program, which teaches kids about important character strengths for learning. We encourage you to talk about these messages with your children. Character strengths like grit, perseverance, and curiosity are very important for learning and can help students do well in school and in life.

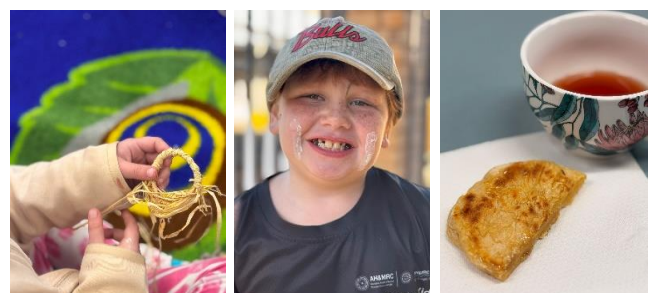
### NAIDOC Celebrations

At the end of Term 2, students and staff enjoyed a day of cultural learning and celebration to acknowledge NAIDOC week. The children engaged in a range of cultural experiences, including dance, sand art, weaving and traditional games led by visiting artists and school staff. Our P&C provided a yummy sausage sizzle lunch, and we thank them for their time and generosity.

The 2025 NAIDIC theme is The Next Generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy. In a recent letter sent to the school praising students for their powerful poetry about The Stolen Generation, Uncle Dennis Dunn wrote:

*"I am writing this to firstly praise the students in years 3 to 6 .... who put this book together... As I read through the book it reawakened many memories, but most of all it showed me their insight and compassion... I believe and see that the students who put this book together will be our futures, our next generations of leaders continuing to make us former Stolen Generation proud and knowing that what happened to us will not happen to our next generations that come".*

Uncle Dennis' words capture the way our Listen, Learn and Lead motto is put into action, as we witness our next generation of leaders emerging with strength, vision, and a commitment to creating a better future for all.





## Regular School Attendance

For all students to achieve their very best in learning, and stay on track with their progress, regular school attendance must be a priority. As a learning community, we all need to work together to improve our school's attendance rate, so that all students attend school at least 90% of the time. Please speak with your child's teacher if you are needing support for your child to attend school on time every day.

Please remember that our school day starts at 8:55am and finishes at 2:55pm. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school.

Justified reasons for student absences may include being sick, unavoidable medical

appointments, attending recognised religious holidays or exceptional or urgent family circumstances (e.g. attending a funeral).

Following a partial or full day absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence.

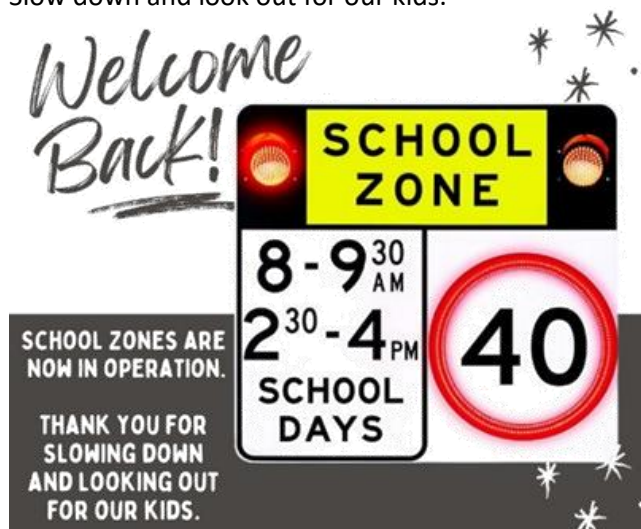
### Did you know that

- being 30 minutes late each day can lead to your child missing up to 20 school days each year?
- missing one day each fortnight is equivalent to missing a month of school each year
- missing one day per week is equivalent to missing 8 weeks (or almost a term) of school each year.

## Road Safety

Welcome back for another term. Please remember school zones are now back in operation from 8am to 9:30am and from 2:30pm to 4pm. The 40km/h school zone slows traffic around schools and must be observed, even if school children cannot be seen.

Slow down and look out for our kids.



## DOE Mobile Phone Policy

In primary schools, the Department of Education has banned students from using mobile phones during school hours. Whilst we understand that some students may need to have a mobile phone on them on the way to and from school, any mobile phone brought to school by a student MUST be handed to the office on their arrival and collected again when they leave. Failure of students to comply with this is a clear breach of Department of Education Policy.

## Flags on Fridays

Flags on Fridays will happen throughout the year which involves students meeting on certain weeks in their sports houses to do activities together. The aim of the initiative is to foster peer relationships outside of class groups, support staff in getting to know all our students and elevate the role of our House Captains. Over time, it is expected that these house groups will grow into wellbeing groups, aligning with Strategic Direction 2 in our Strategic Improvement Plan: Connect, Succeed, Thrive (a planned approach to wellbeing).

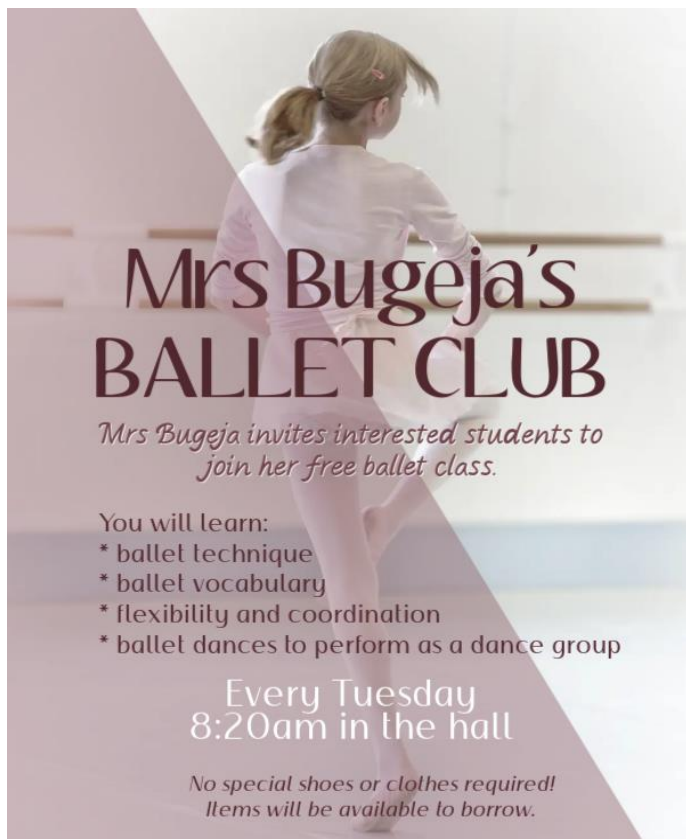

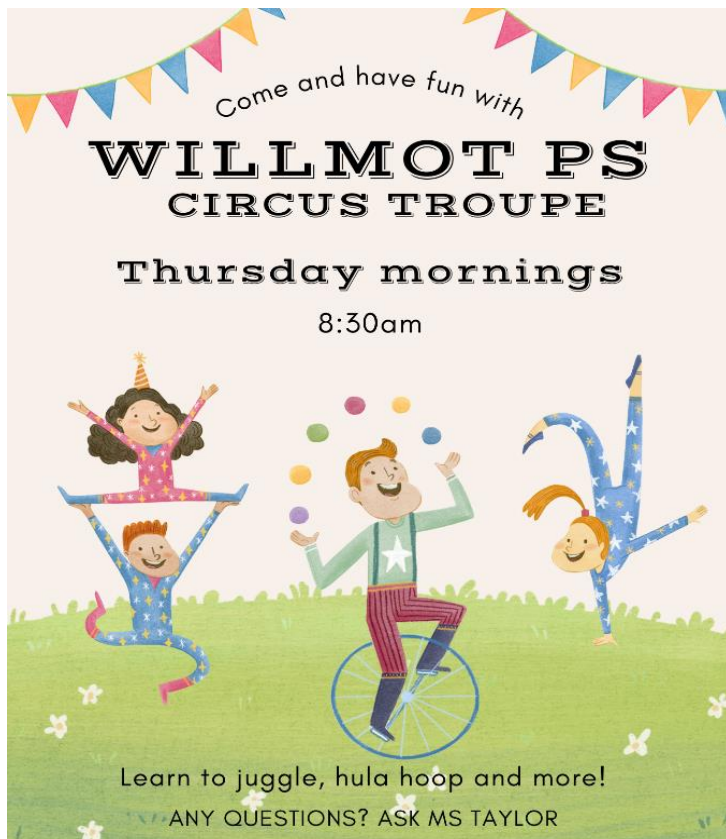

### Public Education Week

### Education Week – Westfield CAPA Performance

Willmot Public School students will be performing at Westfield Mount Druitt to celebrate Education Week and will be showcasing their hard work and creativity with the wider community. During week 4, students will be participating in a range of classroom activities that have been designed by our student leaders, alongside our teachers, to acknowledge Bullying No Way Week. We will be finishing the week with a Pyjama Day on Friday 15 August as a reminder for everyone to be comfy and be you. ### Office Closure – Week 4

Due to our Admin team participating in a 2-day conference in Week 4, our front office will be closed from Monday 11 to Tuesday 12 August.

This means that several services, including uniform purchasing and making other payments via the front office etc, will not be available. We will have other school staff covering essential front office duties only like administering medication, sick bay and first aid, answering phones, opening gates etc.

We fully support our amazing front office team accessing professional development opportunities and apologise for any inconvenience that their absence may cause.

### Swim School Program

Arrangements have been made to include a learn to swim program in our school curriculum during week 4 of Term 3. The Department of Education and Training School Swimming Scheme is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival.



Students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water, are eligible to participate in the School Swimming Scheme.

The Scheme focuses on non-swimmers in Year 2 and 3 but provides for weak swimmers in Years 3-6.

This event is now full.

### Deadly Science Incursion

In recognition of Science Week, students in Years 5 and 6 will be participating in the Deadly Science incursion – Decoding the Universe. Students will delve into the mysteries of the Universe by exploring the fundamental languages of nature, including mathematics and the groundbreaking field of quantum science.

### First Foot Forward On-Campus Excursion

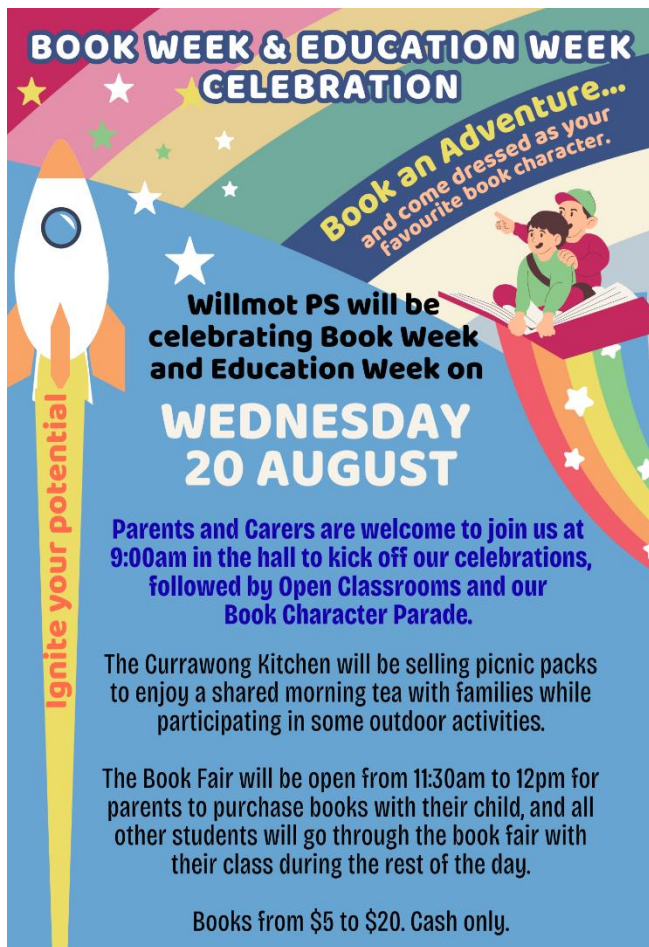

### Lunches Unwrapped Incursion

littering on the environment and communities. Students will develop an understanding of how waste is sorted and where it ends up, and identify the best practices in packing lunches, how to avoid waste and which bin is best to use when it cannot be avoided.

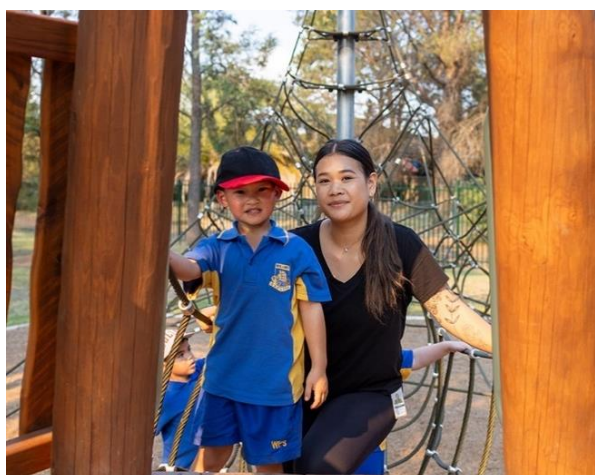
This service is available to students enrolled at Willmot Public School and is located inside the school grounds.

Service provided:

- Kindergarten children are picked-up and dropped-off to their classroom in the before and after school care.
- Academic support is offered through 'homework help'
- Well balanced afternoon tea, including fruit, healthy snacks and yoghurts
- Sustainability is emphasised at the service, with children learning about responsibility through tending to the on-site vegetable and fruit garden.

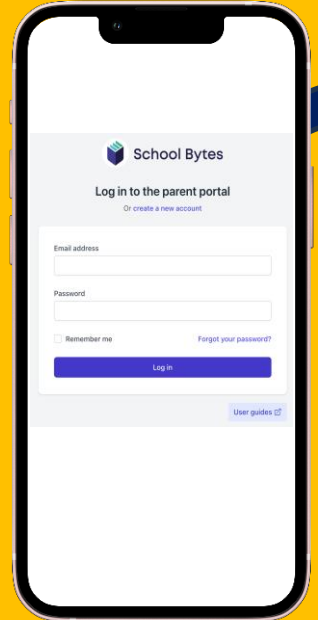

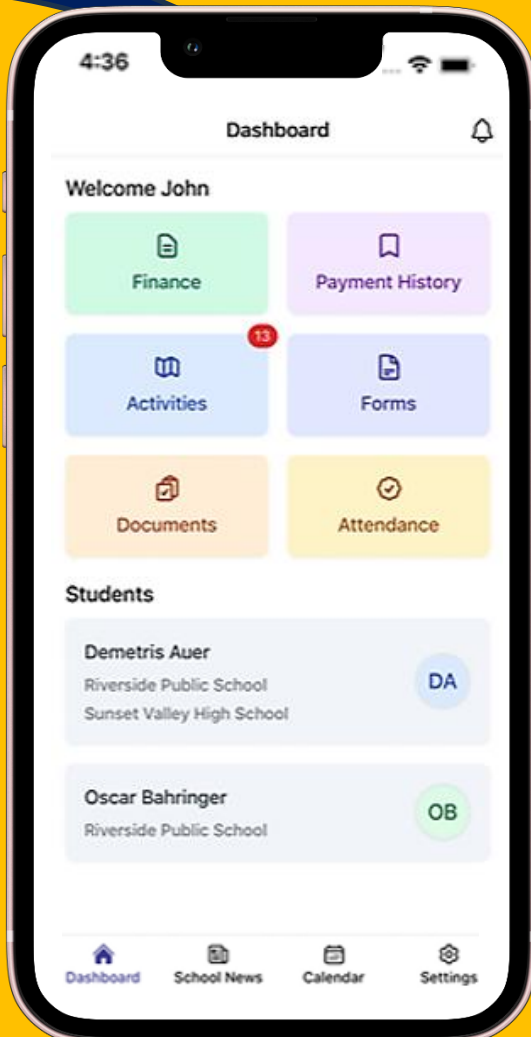

## School Bytes Parent Portal and App

Willmot Public School uses School Bytes to assist with parent communication. School Bytes provides our school, and our families, with many benefits including:

- Instant messages to the Parent Portal (including push notifications) or via SMS message to your mobile
- Permission notes can be completed online, meaning no lost notes in school bags
- Payments for excursions and uniforms can be made online. You are also able to review past payments and Statements of Account. For some events, multiple part payments can be made allowing you to make payments when it best suits you.
- Student Absences can be explained via the Portal
- Changes to student details can done via the Portal
- View the school calendar to assist with planning for upcoming events
- Multiple email addresses per family can be setup to ensure no one misses out on important communications
- From 2024, student reports will be contained in the Portal. Printed copies will still be sent home, but parents can also access their child's report in School Bytes.
- From 2024, digital forms will be added to the Parent Portal so parents can access uniform order forms, canteen menus, change of detail forms along with many other forms.

## School Bytes Parent Portal Set Up

To register for the School Bytes Parent Portal, the email you use to sign up will need to match the email address that we have on the system for you. If you are using a different email address, an SMS verification code will be sent to the mobile number that we have on record for you.

### Set Up Process

1. Use the link or the QR code to register for the parent portal.

2. Click on 'Create a new account'.
3. Enter your details into the required fields and then select 'create account'.

*An email will be sent to the email address nominated so that you can verify your access to the email address. Once you have created your account, log in to the School Bytes parent portal.*

*You can now link your account to all students in schools that use the School Bytes platform. When linking a student, the system automatically matches the data you provide with details stored on the student's school profile.*

4. Select 'Link other student' and search for Willmot public School in the 'School name' field. Continue entering the students details and select 'Search'.

*If all student information matches with parent information according to the student's official enrolment stored at the school, the system will add the student to the parent account automatically.*

5. Continue adding any additional children that you have enrolled at Willmot Public School.

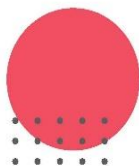
