A message from Principal Mrs Bugeja

This newsletter arrives during **School Support Recognition Week**, which is our annual opportunity to celebrate the contributions of school administrative and support staff (SASS) and other support staff who keep our schools running smoothly.

Regular School Attendance

For every student to achieve their very best and stay on track with their learning, regular school attendance must be a top priority. When children are at school every day, they have the best chance to learn new skills, take part in engaging lessons, and enjoy fun activities with their friends.

As a learning community, we are committed to working together to lift our school's attendance rate, with the expectation that all students attend school at least 90% of the time. We hold high expectations for attendance because being present each day helps children build confidence, form friendships, and develop the skills they need for the future.

Every day counts, and being on time each morning is just as important. If you need support to help your child attend regularly and punctually, please speak with your child's teacher.

Our school day begins at 8:55am and ends at 2:55pm. While there may be times when an absence is unavoidable, these should be limited to genuine and justifiable reasons such as illness, unavoidable medical appointments, recognised religious holidays, or exceptional family circumstances (e.g. a funeral). When your child is absent for any part of the day, you must provide the school with a verbal or written explanation within 7 days.

DOE Mobile Phone Policy

In primary schools, the Department of Education has banned students from using mobile phones during school hours. Whilst we understand that some students may need to have a mobile phone on them on the way to and from school, any mobile phone brought to school by a student MUST be handed to the office on their arrival and collected again when they leave. Failure of students to comply with this is a clear breach of Department of Education Policy.



New Website

Willmot PS was part of the first group of 200 schools to upgrade their website, which went live at the end of last week. With 14 million visits to NSW public school websites last year, the Department of Education understands the importance of school websites as a communication tool. This upgrade responds to school feedback about needing a simpler, easier-to-use platform, and parent research on what families want to see when using school websites to find information.

E-bikes:

Use and storage on school grounds

As e-bike use is growing in our community, it's important for our school to set clear directions for their use and storage on school grounds. These directions help keep everyone safe and maintain an organised environment.

Below are the specific guidelines for e-bike use and storage at our school:

Are students permitted to ride an e-bike to school?

Yes, students can ride a privately owned e-bike to school if it meets Transport for NSW's requirements.

There are two types of permitted e-bikes:

- Power-assisted pedal cycles
- Electrically power-assisted cycles



The rider must propel these bikes- a motor can't be the only source propelling it and they cannot exceed 25km/h.

Can e-bikes be charged on school grounds?

Charging of e-bike lithium-ion batteries is not permitted on school grounds.



Can e-bikes be stored on school grounds?

Work, Health and Safety advice requires e-bikes to be stored in a location away from structures. This is aimed to minimise fire risks.

At our school, students are to store their e-bike in the bike cage.

E-bikes that don't comply with the TfNSW requirements will not be allowed to be stored on school grounds.

Do the same rules apply for e-scooters?

In NSW, it is illegal to ride a privately owned **e-scooter** on public roads or road-related areas including footpaths and cycle ways. **E-scooters are therefore not permitted on school grounds.**



Flags on Fridays

Flags on Fridays will happen throughout the year which involves students meeting on certain weeks in their sports houses to do activities together. The aim of the initiative is to foster peer relationships outside of class groups, support staff in getting to know all our students and elevate the role of our House Captains. Over time, it is expected that these house groups will grow into wellbeing groups, aligning with Strategic Direction 2 in our Strategic Improvement Plan: Connect, Succeed, Thrive (a planned approach to wellbeing).

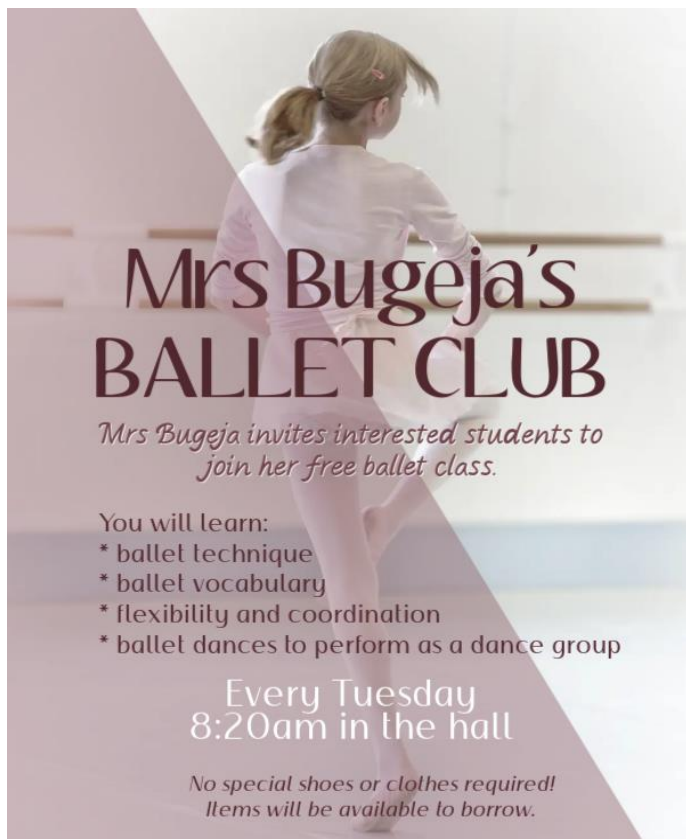

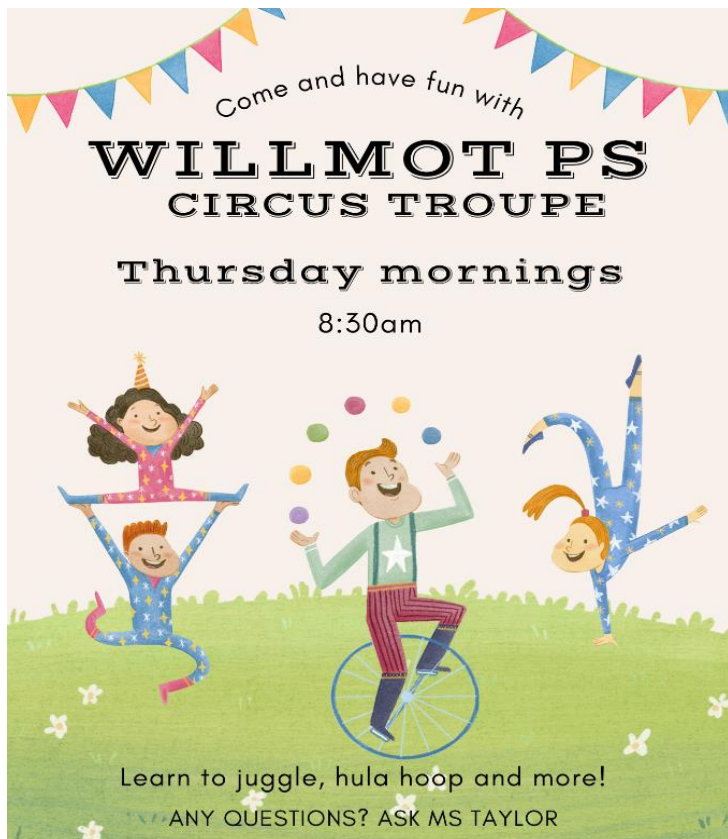

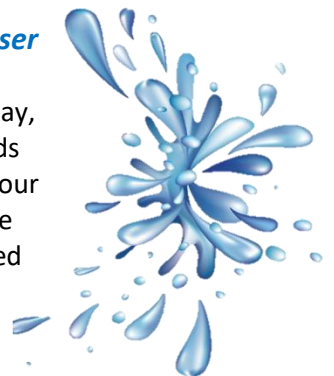
We would like to remind families who have given permission for their child to attend camp, to please:

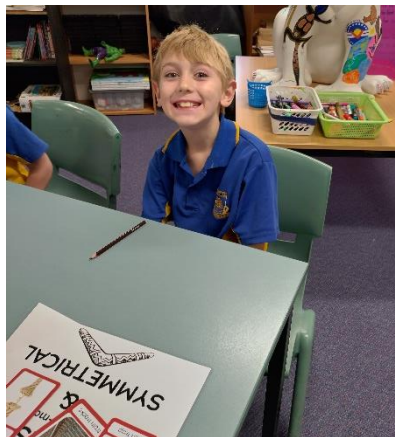
Swim School Program

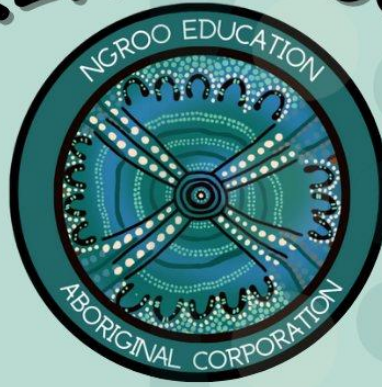

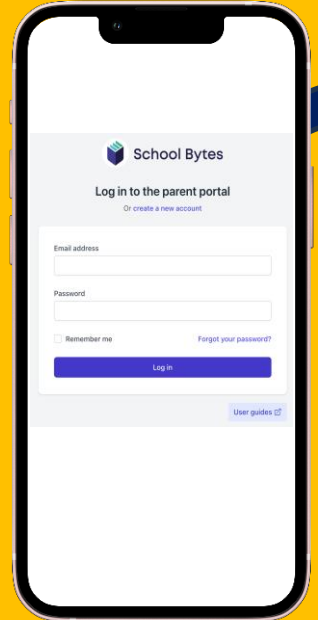

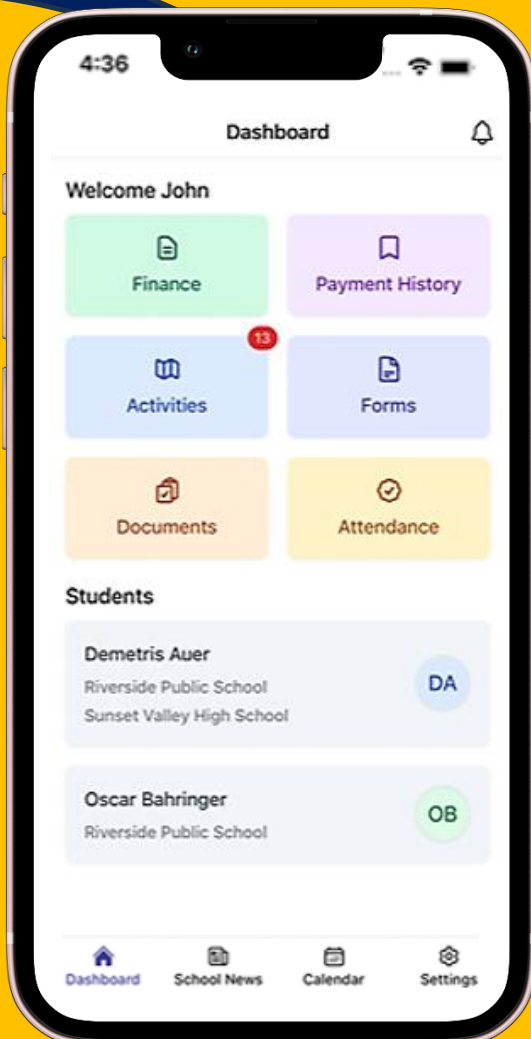

School Bytes Parent Portal and App

Willmot Public School uses School Bytes to assist with parent communication. School Bytes provides our school, and our families, with many benefits including:

- Instant messages to the Parent Portal (including push notifications) or via SMS message to your mobile
- Permission notes can be completed online, meaning no lost notes in school bags
- Payments for excursions and uniforms can be made online. You are also able to review past payments and Statements of Account. For some events, multiple part payments can be made allowing you to make payments when it best suits you.
- Student Absences can be explained via the Portal
- Changes to student details can done via the Portal
- View the school calendar to assist with planning for upcoming events
- Multiple email addresses per family can be setup to ensure no one misses out on important communications
- From 2024, student reports will be contained in the Portal. Printed copies will still be sent home, but parents can also access their child's report in School Bytes.
- From 2024, digital forms will be added to the Parent Portal so parents can access uniform order forms, canteen menus, change of detail forms along with many other forms.

School Bytes Parent Portal Set Up

To register for the School Bytes Parent Portal, the email you use to sign up will need to match the email address that we have on the system for you. If you are using a different email address, an SMS verification code will be sent to the mobile number that we have on record for you.

Set Up Process

1. Use the link or the QR code to register for the parent portal.

<https://portal.schoolbytes.education>



2. Click on 'Create a new account'.
3. Enter your details into the required fields and then select 'create account'.

An email will be sent to the email address nominated so that you can verify your access to the email address. Once you have created your account, log in to the School Bytes parent portal.

You can now link your account to all students in schools that use the School Bytes platform. When linking a student, the system automatically matches the data you provide with details stored on the student's school profile.

4. Select 'Link other student' and search for Willmot public School in the 'School name' field. Continue entering the students details and select 'Search'.

If all student information matches with parent information according to the student's official enrolment stored at the school, the system will add the student to the parent account automatically.

5. Continue adding any additional children that you have enrolled at Willmot Public School.

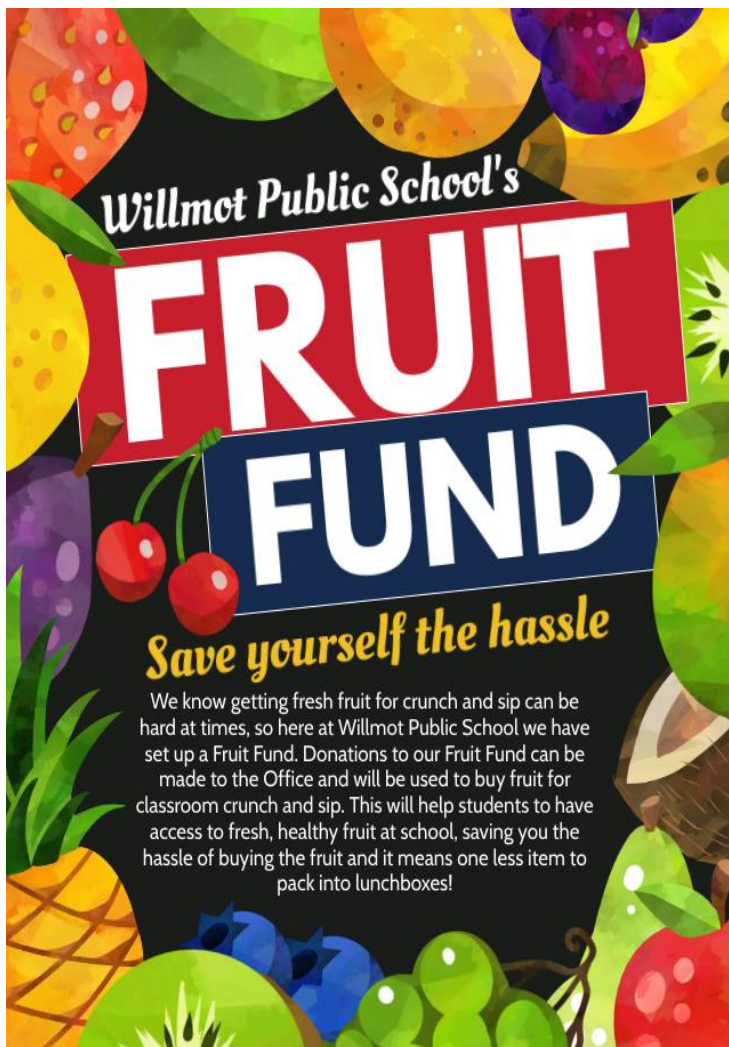
