#### MERIT AWARD SCHEME

Willyama High School has a whole-school coordinated merit system that is designed to recognise and reward all students who try hard and achieve to the best of their ability.

In recognising students who have achieved excellence we acknowledge achievements in the academic, extra-curricular, cultural and service fields within our school community.

Willyama High School students can receive a merit award in three ways:

- 1. during the merit review period (held in Weeks 5 and 10 of each Term), where teachers reflect on students' academic application over the previous five weeks and award merit certificates based on student effort and achievement;
- 2. for participating in out of the ordinary events in academic, cultural, extra-curricular or service fields. Examples include participating in external competitions, performing in school concerts, representing the school in sport, or marching for the school on ANZAC Day; and
- 3. for displaying school values and/or citizenship. Students who consistently show respect, responsibility and cooperation (for example: being in the right place at the right time, respecting others' right to learn and treating everyone justly) will be recognised.

The School Merit System will be an ongoing system which will begin when the student first enrols at Willyama High School and will continue until they officially sign out.

A **Merit Award** will be presented to students for positive participation in academic, cultural, extra curricular or service activities.

A **School Merit Award** will be presented to every student who gains 10 Merit Awards. These awards will be presented to the student at their year presentation assembly.

A **Certificate of Excellence** will be presented to any student who gains 3 School Merit Awards. This presentation will be made at the student's year presentation ceremony.

A **Principal's Award** is presented to any student who receives 6 School Merit Awards. This will be presented to eligible students at their year presentation ceremony.

A Principal's Medallion is presented to any student who receives 9 School



#### LIBRARY NEWS

The 2013 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge has commenced at Willyama with all Year 7 classes as well as students in Years 8 and 9 taking part. The reading challenge is not a competition but rather a means of exposing students to a wide selection of quality literature and encouraging them to enjoy reading.

Last year 235,000 students across NSW schools from Kindergarten to Year 9 took part in the challenge. The reading journey starts in March and finishes early September at which time students are expected to have read a minimum of 20 books, 15 to be selected from the PRC booklist and 5 of personal choice. All students who take part and finish this reading journey will receive an official Premier's Reading Challenge certificate and their names will appear on the PRC Honour Roll.

#### LIBRARY PROGRAM

At the beginning of Term 1, all Year 7 students commenced a Library program. This involved students working with me in the library one day per week instead of attending their timetabled English/Science class.

At the end of the term all Year 7 students completed the program and have acquired knowledge and skills in the following areas;

- The location of the Library, the services it provides and the role of the staff.
- How to use OASIS Web Library to access the Library catalogue, web 2 tools, recommended KLA resources and to locate resources according to the Dewey Decimal System.
- Parts of a book.
- The information skills process and how it is used to complete assignments successfully.
- Note taking and note making skills.
- Concept mapping / brainstorming.
- How to use different search engines to get the best from the
- internet.
- How to use the electronic databases "Worldbook online" and "Bigchalk library".
- How to write a bibliography for various media.

One period a week, for one term is not enough for all Year 7 students to be efficient in all these areas, however their knowledge and skills will be developed as students are assisted by the Teacher Librarian and Classroom Teacher when researching in the Library.

Students will be bringing their Library workbook home as it showcases their work but also contains user names/passwords for electronic databases available to them 24/7 to as-

sist with their assignments and how to write a bibliography for various media.

I thank the English and Science departments for accommodating this valuable program and encourage you to discuss the information contained in their Library book.
