Dear Parents and Carers,

The technical challenges of sound, lighting and visual images in this show are huge, but teachers and students worked together to overcome those challenges.





Year 10 Fundraising - Car Wash Initiative


Well done to our **Year 10 students** who have been actively washing staff cars to raise funds to support their peers in attending the **Year 10 Formal** in **Term 4**.

This week Ciara Sheehy shares her reflections on her time at Winmalee High and where life has taken her since.




To the Winmalee High School Staff,


