After watching the opening night show, I listened to Queen tunes all the way home. The matinee show today for local primary school students and nursing home residents was outstanding. Teacher Excellence Award - On Tuesday, Mrs Madeleine Sheehy, attended a regional award ceremony to receive the Executive Director's Teacher Excellence Award. Nominated by Mr Pendergast, she was selected to receive this prestigious award based on the achievement and success of Drama over many years at Winmalee High School. This includes achievements in HSC Drama; student HSC results, nominations and participation of students at state level and her service to NESA as senior marker for the HSC. Winmalee: Will Rock You

WE WILL Rock You isn't just a musical about a rock concert - it is a rock concert. right down to the electric atmosphere and feeling in your bones

The Winmalee High School makes the school hall feel more like front row stadium seating. Lighting trusses are shown proudly, pyrotechnics spew flashing sparks and the musicians can be sign front-and-centre smas' ang out Queen's hits,

Like all the school's productions, We Will Rock You is a joint effort from across nearly every year and faculty. Dance teachers provide choreography, the poster was designed in a Year 10 Visual

Arts assessment task, and various other students assist with costumes, ticketing, directing and more.

Music Director Craig Mc-Gown said: "Everyone just does their little bit, and that's what's really magical about Winmalee High School... It's a real collective effort across the school.

Year 12 student Tahlia Mc-Gown stars in her first lead role as Scaramouche, and said the production is a welcome challenge compared to her previous roles.

Tve been involved in three school musicals now. Wizard of Oz, and then Matilda, and now We Will Rock You," she said.

"It's very exciting. Very different to every other musical I've ever done. I've never done a rock show. So it's been a bit challenging, but I've figured it out."




