Ms Facas is reading.....


This is a well-structured, engaging read that uses data to make the connection between the rise in the use of smart phones and the decline in adolescent mental health.

I really appreciated the exploration of the different impacts that mobile phones and social media have on males and females as they are developing.

Haidt makes some compelling arguments, and he shares current research to show the fundamental ways in which a phone-based childhood can impact sleep, relationships and cause focus and addiction issues. This read made me really value the mobile phone ban even more. He also shares solutions to promote independence and responsibility in the real world.

At the time of the book's release, I also listened to an interview with the author on Radio National's <u>Conversations</u>. It was around the time that the State Government had announced the ban of social media for young people under the age of 16. Haidt highly praised our government's bold move on this.

If you don't get the opportunity to read the book but you are interested in this topic, the <u>interview</u> is a great introduction.


