I am pleased to share some highlights from our school community this week.

Congratulations to Year 8 student **Ruby Broadhurst**, who represented Emu Plains at the Panthers vs. Storm game on August 14th. Ruby participated in the pre-match relay at CommBank Stadium, adding to her achievements in touch football, rugby league, cross country, and athletics. Her dedication across sports is inspiring.

Last week, Year 8 students took part in an incursion by Sydney Water's Education Team on the urban water cycle. They learned how water is sourced, managed, and protected, and the role science plays in sustainable water use. We look forward to a follow-up session on local water management.

In sport, Year 7's Elyse Walker competed at the Australian Cross Country Championships, representing Team NSW. Despite a challenging course, Elyse finished 29th in the Under-14 category and 6th among NSW runners. She also ran in the mixed relay, gaining valuable experience.

Ride for Kidz - Yesterday we welcomed local Rotary members and organisers for Ride for Kidz, Michael, Leigh and Pamela to our school assembly. We learned about the incredible fundraising efforts that were made to build schools and buy computers in Cambodia and Papua New Guinea. Winmalee High was part of fundraising in the past, and Michael presented our school with a certificate of appreciation. It was wonderful for students and staff to see photos of students and community in those schools, and to see the direct impact of fundraising.

We're thrilled to share the stories of our former students with the school and wider community, highlighting their experiences at WHS and the diverse journeys they've taken since graduating.


This week Anthea Perrin shares her reflections on her time at Winmalee High and where life has taken her since.



WHAT EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES WERE YOU INVOLVED IN AT SCHOOL?


Basketball mostly.
