Rain Gardens to Recycled Water - Students Explore Sustainability

A group of Year 8 students took part in Aqua Innovate – an on-site learning experience at Sydney Water's Quakers Hill Purified Recycled Water (PRW) Discovery Centre. During the excursion, students explored the cutting-edge technologies behind purified recycled water and investigated the challenges of water scarcity and resiliency. They also gained insight into how water resources are sourced and managed, both locally and around the world.

After Sydney Water's PRW Discovery Centre, students were given a tour of local biofilters and rain gardens, led by Will Goodwin and Sophia Joyner from Blue Mountains City Council. This allowed students to see practical, real-world examples of sustainable water management in action.



The excursion was a valuable experience, deepening students' understanding of water as a precious resource and inspiring them to think critically about future solutions for sustainability.



This week Matthew Brown shares his reflections on his time at Winmalee High and where life has taken him since.


