

Report by Zoe Jobson (Year 7)

The Tournament of Minds is a competition with four divisions: STEM, social sciences, language literature, and the arts. This year Winmalee HS entered two STEM teams into the competition, the Goblin Gang and the Nebulas. This year, the challenge was to create an emblem that represented the four natural spheres, the lithosphere, biosphere, atmosphere, and hydrosphere, that fell apart, then came back together stronger. Both teams started strong with creative and unique ideas.

The Goblin Gang had four octagons, each one smaller than the last. They connected with strings on a large stand, which they then cut and replaced with wire.

The Nebulas had two spheres, one that was smaller and went inside the other. The outside one then fell apart and reconnected, metaphorically stronger.

Each team also had to complete a secret spontaneous challenge that couldn't be revealed until the end of the day. Each team only gets four minutes to think and talk and one minute to present their solution to the judges. The question was open-ended, and teams were judged on their ability to work together as a team.

Both teams did very well, with the Nebulas winning merits, meaning they were in the top 30% of scores. It was a good day overall and was very fun.



All Eyes on Year 12

Our Year 12 Biology students recently completed their final dissection of the year – the eye. This hands-on investigation allowed students to explore the intricate structures of the eye, including the lens, cornea, retina and optic nerve, and to connect their theoretical learning about vision to real biological anatomy.






It was a valuable opportunity to consolidate their understanding of the $\,$








My name is Michael and in 2024 I'm in Year 4 at school.
