Year 11 have officially commenced their HSC courses, and they received their jerseys on the first day back. We congratulate Year 11 on competing their End of course Exams last term.



#### Winmalee High Students Gain a Head Start in Aviation Careers

In Term 3, 29 Winmalee High School students successfully completed the **Western Sydney University Micro-Credential in Aviation**, a program designed to provide **job-ready**, **foundational aviation skills** and support students' **entry into the aviation workplace**.

With the Western Sydney International (WSI) Airport set to open in 2026, this micro-credential gives students an incredible head start into future aviation career opportunities.

Throughout the term, students engaged in a series of online modules covering key areas such as aviation operations, communications and teamwork, safety and security, workplace compliance, digital tools, and situational awareness.

To consolidate their learning, students then attended a two-day practical workshop on Monday 22 September and Tuesday 23 September at Western Sydney University's Parramatta Campus.

Here, they applied their knowledge to real-world aviation scenarios and worked collaboratively to solve industry-style challenges.

The program coordinators were highly impressed by

the maturity, teamwork, and critical thinking demonstrated by Winmalee students, commenting that they **performed beyond expectations** -even exceeding the engagement and insight shown by many mature-aged participants.





The students now have an excursion to **Western Sydney International Airport** to look forward to later in the term!


