


Congratulations to **Aurora Edwards of Year 10**, who was presented with the Zonta Club of the Blue Mountains "Vision of the Future" Award.

### **Congratulations to Trinity Bunter**

This week at assembly, we proudly recognised **Trinity Bunter (Year 7)** for her courageous actions in a reallife emergency. Trinity was awarded by the NSW Ambulance Service for her quick thinking and bravery in administering CPR to a family member in need, with guidance from the Triple Zero (000) emergency call service.

Following the presentation, NSW Ambulance representatives stayed on campus to provide basic CPR training to interested students, encouraging our community to be prepared to save lives.

They also introduced the GoodSAM app, a lifesaving tool that alerts CPR-trained individuals nearby to emergencies involving cardiac arrest. If you have CPR training, you can <u>register with NSW ambulance</u> and be ready to help while ambulance services are en route.





The staff and students of Winmalee High School have come together once again to give generously this Christmas through our new initiative, **Project Elf**. Led by our Year 9 SRC representatives, our school community has been busy preparing boxes and bags of gifts to donate to **DV West.**


