

GOAL OF 95%?



EduChat for Years 5&6

Following a successful trial in schools since 2024, Students in Years 5 & 6 now have access to NSWEduChat, a safe generative artificial attendance (GenAI) tool developed by the Department of Education. NSWEduChat is different to other commonly used GenAI tools. It does not just give direct answers to students. Instead, it provides guidance and asks open-ended questions to encourage students to think critically and express their ideas, reasoning, and assumptions. Staff have had access to NSWEduChat for some time now and it is exciting that this tool is now available for students.

I look forward to seeing many parents and community members at tomorrow's assembly, hosted by Year 2/3. The next assembly after that will be K/1 in Week 5.

Our NDIS services offer therapeutic interventions for children aged 2-12 years who have an NDIS plan.

RFW NDIS Services are suitable for children with mild to moderate disability who live in rural and remote areas. The program supports Early Childhood Approach (ECA – previously ECEI) and the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Participants.
