Year 7 Vaccinations

Free vaccines, for all Year 7 students

Dear Parent/Guardian

Teams of specially trained registered nurses will be visiting your child's school during Year 7 to offer free vaccinations against serious vaccine-preventable diseases.

Vaccines include:

1. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine (1 dose)
2. Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (dTpa) Vaccine (1 dose)

These vaccines are only offered at school whilst your child is in Year 7

What do you need to do?

- ✓ **Discuss the importance of vaccinations** with your child
- ✓ **Ensure your child has breakfast** on the morning of vaccination

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received

How to provide consent:

1. To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations, visit:
<https://nswhealth.service-now.com/school>
2. Click the login with 'Service NSW Account' button and log in using your Service NSW details. This is the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence. If you don't have a Service NSW account, refer to Service NSW to create one.
3. Update or confirm your personal details in Service NSW as required.
4. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child/ren. You will need to:
 - a. Enter your child's personal details
 - b. Provide the Medicare card details for you and your child
 - c. Read the linked Parent Information Sheet and privacy statement
 - d. Provide consent

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, consent can still be provided by requesting a paper-based consent form directly from your child's school.
