POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. At Woy Woy Public School we strive to create safe classroom, playground, and online learning environments. Behavioural expectations are explicit, fair, consistently applied and jointly constructed. This enables the classrooms and playgrounds to be predictable and thus safe. Strategies used to support this include:

- having clear expectations, structures, routines, and accountability systems that promotes responsibility from all stakeholders.
- fostering positive language and inclusive play at recess and lunch.
- providing 'safe' places for students to go at recess and lunch.
- quality and active supervision of playground and common areas by teachers greeting students as they enter classrooms and checking in with them regularly.

This fortnight teachers and students have been discussing how to 'Be Responsible' on the playground. Lessons and activities have focused on the importance of:

- By taking care of school property
- By taking turns and sharing
- By allowing others to play
- By sharing equipment

Students who are demonstrating positive behaviours are rewarded with 'Yali Tokens', which are accumulated throughout the term and traded in to receive a reward.

As we head into the end of Term 3, it remains important that your child attends school every single day. School is the best place for students to learn as well as to build social connections and life-long skills.



ABORIGINAL EDUCATION NEWS

WOY WOY PUBLIC SCHOOL RECONCILIATION BAROMETER

Every two years, Reconciliation Australia releases findings from The Australian Reconciliation Barometer (ARB), a national research survey, that interviews 2000 everyday Australians to gauge their opinions on reconciliation and find out where we as a nation on our reconciliation journey. In its essence, reconciliation is about strengthening relationships between Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people and other Australians.

We have adapted the questions from The Australian Reconciliation Barometer, made them child friendly and interviewed all **Woy Woy Public School students in years 5 & 6. The findings of this survey (below) are compared to the responses from the Australian Reconciliation Barometer.** I hope to use this data to inform our teaching and **continue this survey annually to find out where WWPS is on our journey towards reconciliation.**

OUR FINDINGS

RACE RELATIONS

- 99% of students think it's important that relationships are positive between Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people and other Australians compared to 89% of everyday Australians
- 96% of students believe racism is a problem in Australia compared to 42% of everyday Australians

EQUALITY & EQUITY

• 96% of students think it's important for Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people to have a say in matters that affect them compared to 93% of everyday Australians

UNITY

- 99% of students are proud of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander cultures compared to 58% of everyday Australians
- 92% of students agree that it's important to teach Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander histories & cultures at school compared to 84% of everyday Australians
- 70% of students want to do something to improve reconciliation compared to 53% of everyday Australians

HISTORICAL ACCEPTANCE

- 87% of students believe Australia's shared history should be taught truthfully compared to 83% of everyday Australians
- 62% of students believe that we need to correct past mistakes before we can move on with reconciliation compared to 27% of everyday Australians

Thank you to Mrs Stride and Mr Graham for your time and support.



SEMESTER 1 REPORTS

This Semester we're introducing an updated format to our school reports. The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to feedback from parents and educators to make reports easier to read and understand. Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas. Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy. The general comment for Kindergarten also covers other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology. A new achievement scale and descriptions are included below to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress. This is outlined below.

We will be holding two information sessions in Week 9 about our new report format. More details will follow about this. Reports will be available for all parents and carers on the SENTRAL app during Week 10.

ICAS Assessments



We are pleased to inform you that Woy Woy Public School will be participating in the worldrenowned ICAS competitions this year.

What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem- solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee, and Digital Technologies. Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals. We encourage you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year.

How to Participate in ICAS

If you wish for your child to participate in ICAS this year, please:

- 1. Read about ICAS subjects and prices: https://www.icasassessments.com/products-icas
- 2. Go to ICAS Parent Portal: https://shop.icasassessments.com/pages/pps
- 3. Enter our school's access code FAE156
- 4. Enter your child's details, select the tests you would like to purchase, then proceed to payment.

After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records. ICAS Assessments will need to be purchased via the Parent Payment System no later than Friday 18 July.

The ICAS assessments are an online format. We will release the exact sitting dates closer to the testing window.

Please note- if your child is unable to sit an assessment due to illness, unfortunately, there will not be another opportunity to sit the test.


I look forward to hearing about your problem solving experiences and how sweaty they make your brains!




Book Week




