

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school. At Woy Woy Public School we strive to create safe classroom, playground, and online learning environments. Behavioural expectations are explicit, fair, consistently applied and jointly constructed. This enables the classrooms and playgrounds to be predictable and thus safe. Strategies used to support this include:


- having clear expectations, structures, routines, and accountability systems that promotes responsibility from all stakeholders.
- fostering positive language and inclusive play at recess and lunch.
- providing 'safe' places for students to go at recess and lunch.
- quality and active supervision of playground and common areas by teachers greeting students as they enter classrooms and checking in with them regularly.

This fortnight teachers and students have been discussing how to 'Be Respectful' in the classroom. Lessons and activities have focused on the importance of:

- By allowing others to learn and teachers to teach
- By showing whole body listening
- By following class expectations
- By speaking politely to others

Students who are demonstrating positive behaviours are rewarded with 'Yali Tokens', which are accumulated throughout the term and traded in to receive a reward.

Relationships

Positive relationships between children and their caregivers are extremely important for their development. They develop best when they have strong, loving, positive relationships with carers. These relationships help them learn about the world, what love and care looks like, what happens when they cry, laugh, make mistakes, and so much more.

So how do we know if we're doing it right? Well, all we can do is try our best. Some ways to build positive relationships with our children is by:

BEING IN THE MOMENT

Being in the moment is about tuning in and thinking about what's going on with your child. It shows your child that you care about the things that matter to them, which is the basis for a strong relationship.

- Show acceptance
- Notice what they are doing, what they care about, where their focus is
- Listen and tune into their feelings
- Think about what their behaviour is communicating

SPENDING QUALITY TIME

Time together is how you get to know about each other's experiences, thoughts, feelings and changing interests. This shows that you value and appreciate your child, which is great for your relationship. Quality time can happen anytime and anywhere:

- A laugh when you share a joke while getting ready for bed
- A conversation in the car on the way to school/sport/a friend's house
- Writing the shopping list together
- Dinner at the table

SHOWING TRUST AND RESPECT

Children feel secure when they learn they can trust people to meet their needs. This sense of safety and security gives children the confidence to explore the world, to ask questions, try new things, and develop new relationships.

- Be available; for conversations, help, care, or support when your child seeks it
- Stick to your promises
- Listen to and support a difference of opinion
- Respect and admire their interests and strengths
- Set firm but fair family rules clear statements about how your family work; how you treat each other, how you handle disagreements, how rewards are earned, etc.







