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Welcome to Woy Woy Public School

Our school is located on the beautiful peninsula of the Southern Central Coast. We are proud to provide a supportive, inclusive, and engaging learning environment for students from Preschool to Year 6.

Our school community is diverse, with over 20% of students identifying as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander. We value and celebrate Aboriginal culture, working closely with the Koorana AECG and the Mingaletta Aunties to ensure our students feel a strong sense of belonging and cultural connection.

Woy Woy Public School hosts seven support classes, providing tailored programs for students with additional learning needs and disabilities. We are committed to equity, inclusion, and acceptance, offering diverse learning opportunities to meet the academic, social, and wellbeing needs of every student.

We are also proud of our Guliyali Preschool, which has two classes and 40 students enrolled in a five-day fortnight program. The preschool lays a strong foundation for learning and helps children transition smoothly into formal schooling the following year.


Equity, inclusion, and acceptance are central to our culture. We offer diverse and differentiated learning opportunities across the school, with targeted programs for High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) students and strong support for students from English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EALD) backgrounds. Student voice is highly valued, with students actively contributing to decision-making, wellbeing initiatives, and school improvement through leadership roles and representative groups.

As a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) school, we teach and model our values of Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Engaged. Our school motto, I Aspire, reflects our belief that every child can achieve their personal best. Our vision, Empowering all students, guides everything we do as we nurture confident, resilient, and successful learners.

Our leadership team, including five Assistant Principals, an Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction (APCI), and a Deputy Principal (DP I&S), works alongside our dedicated staff to ensure high-quality teaching, learning, and wellbeing programs for all students.

At Woy Woy Public School, we value strong partnerships with parents, carers, and the wider community. Together, we create a safe, respectful, and welcoming environment where students are inspired to learn, grow, and contribute positively to society.

Access to Staff

The school encourages regular contact between parents/carers and teachers. There are times during the day when teachers are unable to be contacted because they are teaching or have other school commitments. Therefore, it is advisable to arrange a convenient time if an extended interview is required. This can be done via the Parent Portal or through our office.

Additional Needs

Students with additional learning needs are catered for through the provision of quality, differentiated teaching and learning programs and the implementation of learning adjustments as appropriate. The classroom teacher will work alongside the Learning and Support Teacher and parents/carers to develop a Personalised Learning and Support Plan (PLaSP) if this is required. Parents are encouraged to share any external reports such as speech, occupation therapy or other required therapy/testing with the school.

Arrival and Departure from School

Arrival

Students should arrive at school between 8:30am and 8:50am. Playgrounds are supervised from 8:30am and the school cannot accept responsibility for students before this time. Before school care is available, from 6:30am to 8:30am, at our CUBBY OOSH which is run from our school hall. Students must be booked into this facility by contacting them directly on 1300 553 583.

Punctuality is important to ensure you do not disrupt the learning of your child and their classmates. If you arrive after 8:50am you and your child must report to the front office to have the lateness documented in the roll. Printed late notes should be given to the class teacher.



Leaving Early

If you wish to take your child home early, you must come to the office to document the early departure. This ensures that we know the whereabouts of all our students.

Aspire Home Reading Program

Home Reading is an integral part of the Woy Woy Public School reading program. This is an opportunity to share the experience of reading with your child. Sharing reading is one way to promote a positive attitude towards reading and to develop reading skills.

Books are rewarded after reading for 100, 200 and 300 nights. As well as book prizes, students are rewarded for reaching other reading milestones in their Aspire Home Reading booklets with Principal stickers & certificates. Those who have also participated in the Aspire Home Reading Program for most nights, also receive a certificate at an end of year assembly.

At the end of the year, students who participated in the Aspire Home Reading Program, are rewarded with a pizza party and book prize.

Assembly

Our Assemblies are run by our school leaders and take place each fortnight (K-6) under our COLA. This is a time to do such things as: celebrate successes, give out awards and certificates, revise Positive Behaviour for Learning expectations along with singing the school song.

Bicycles/Scooters

Students are permitted to ride bicycles/scooters to school. They must wear their helmet and obey the road rules. Students are not permitted to ride in the school grounds and must leave them in the designated areas. Parents/carers are urged to ensure that their child has proper bike control and knowledge of the road rules.

Breakfast Club

Each Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday our Breakfast Club is held in the CA room from 8:20am - 8:50am. We would like to achknowledge the contributions received from our local community to support our Breakfast Club.



Buses

Free travel to school is available to all K-2 students and Years 3-6 students who live beyond a 1.6km radius from school.

All students who catch buses to school are required to have an Opal Card. Information about Opal Cards is available from https://transportnsw.info/tickets-opal/ticket-eligibility-concessions/school-student-travel or phone 131 500.

Respectful, considerate behaviour, as outlined below, is expected from children at all times while travelling to and from school.

- Behave safely at all times and obey driver instructions
- Respect bus property
- Keep fully within the bus
- Speak quietly and stay in one seat
- Look after your own belongings and those of others
- Come directly to school and go directly home after getting off the bus
- Be courteous and considerate of the driver and other passengers

Canteen

The canteen is operated and managed by The Smiling Sandwich, a private contractor. It is open five days per week and provides a variety of hot and cold foods as well as snacks and drinks. Recess & Lunch should be ordered online through the Flexischools App or in person at the canteen, prior to 8:50am




Casual Teachers

Casual or relief teachers assume the same responsibilities and duties as permanent teachers and are employed when a teacher is sick, on leave, attending professional learning or may be taking on additional responsibilities within the school.

Catchment Zone

Each public school in New South Wales has its own catchment zone. General advice is to enrol children at their locally zoned public school. The School Finder website is an excellent resource, showing the designated public primary and secondary school for each residential address in New South Wales. Change of Family Information/Details

New families to the school receive an enrolment form to be completed and returned. This supplies the school with your child and family details as well as any health and emergency contact information. If your family circumstances, address, contact numbers or email change, please inform the school as soon as possible. Our change of family information forms are available from our front office.

Child Protection

Child Protection lessons are mandatory for all NSW schools to deliver. Woy Woy Public School teachers follow the Department of Education policy and procedures in ensuring every child is safe.

All visitors to our school are required to sign in at the front office. All people working with children are required to have a Working with Children Check and complete the Departments required documentation.

Communication

Parents/carers are asked to check their Parent PORTAL regularly in order to remain up-to-date about events, key dates and school programs. The main communications methods are:

- Parent Portal
- Facebook page
- School website

Counsellor

The school counsellor plays a key role in the welfare of the children at the school. School consellors/psychologists work with students, parents/carers and teachers in a variety of ways. Their work includes:

- Assisting parents/carers to make informed decisions about their child's education.
- Assessing students' learning and behaviour.
- Liasing with other agencies concerned with the wellbeing of students.
- Counselling students.

The school counsellor is available each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday or at other times in urgent situations and may be contacted through the office. Interviews are treated confidentially and students do not see the school counsellor without the permission of their parents/carers.

Cultural

Aboriginal student support

We are committed to closing the achievement gap for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. We know that we need to learn about, nurture and value the cultural identity of our Aboriginal students to help them be successful learners.

We welcome Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander family members, parents and carers, as well as community members to our school so that we can get to know each other, learn about the local Aboriginal community and develop shared goals and plans for Aboriginal students.

At WWPS we have a wonderful Aboriginal Education Teacher who helps to provide cultural, academic and wellbeing support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students and their families. A big part of this role is to include the wider school community in making connections to Aboriginal people, cultures and histories. This involves teaching Aboriginal perspectives in all classes.

Multicultural Education

Our school welcomes students, families and community members from all cultural backgrounds. We appreciate difference and diversity and aim to provide a culturally inclusive and responsive environment that benefits all students.

Our teaching and learning programs develop intercultural understanding, promote positive relationships and enable all students to participate as active Australian and global citizens. Our school fosters student wellbeing and community harmony by implementing anti-racism and anti-discrimination strategies that encourage engagement by parents and carers from all backgrounds.

Supporting English Language Learners

Learning English is essential for success at school and effective participation in Australian society. We can provide specialist support to help students learning English as an additional language or dialect (EAL/D).

Dance

Dance is part of the Creative Arts and personal Development Health and Physical Education Key Learning Areas. Extra - curricular dance classes are offered to students in Years 2-6 with performances in competitions and at school events.



Debating and Public Speaking

Debating and Public Speaking form part of many class programs, especially in the senior years. The school extends these programs by participating in debating and public speaking competitions in our local area.

Emergency Evacuation

The school has an emergency evacuation procedure to deal with a variety of situations. The students and staff practice this procedure at regular intervals during the year. All visitors (including parents/carers) must comply with emergency procedures and instructions from staff in the event of an evacuation drill and any emergency.

Driving and Parking

- The school car park is for staff use only please ensure children are not dropped off in this area and please do not park across the school driveway. Children should not use the car park to enter or exit the school at any time.
- Please be aware of the bus zones and the 40kph speed limit around the school at drop-off and pickup times and please do not park across resident's driveways or in the bus zones.
- To avoid traffic incidents, please collect children from the school side of the street or escort students across the road. Our school crossing coordinator is there to assist you both morning and afternoons.
- A Kiss and Drop zone is located in Park Road.

Excursions/Incursions

Excursions are an essential part of a student's learning program as they provide students with first-hand learning experiences that enhance and support classroom studies.

Permission notes are issued for each excursion providing details of the excursion. If water activities are involved, the permission notes will require that parents/carers provide information about whether the student is allowed to participate in swimming activities, the status of the student's swimming abilities and special requirements for students (eg whether they need a floatation device). Parents/carers should ensure the school is aware of any pre-existing medical conditions before the excursion.

The student's family meets the costs for these activities. However, should a family be experiencing financial difficulties, other arrangements may be made with the Principal.

All our teachers are trained in CPR, Anaphylaxis and Emergency Care in order to provide appopriate care whilst on excursions.

Family Court

The school provides information to both parents/carers unless a contrary order from the Family Court or the police is provided to the school. Permission to participate in school excursions and activities is sought from the parent/carer with whom the student resides. Changes to existing arrangements can only be made following the presentation of a new order from the Family Court or police.



Interviews

- Parent-teacher interviews are held during Term 1 & Term 3, with bookings made through the Parent Portal. Please see the school calendar or the Parent Portal for information about the scheduled date and times.
- If you are unable to attend school premises on the afternoon of parent-teacher interviews, you may reserve a time suitable for you and call or email the office to request the meeting be held over the phone instead.

Library

The library services students from Preschool to Year 6 once a week during formal library lessons. Students are encouraged to borrow a book each week that connects to their interests to increase leisure reading time.

The library is open at lunch time for students to engage in a quiet activity and relax in a calm environment. The resources within the library cater to differentiated learning needs throughout the school, while also stocking popular novels and the latest picture books. The library collection is monitored and restocked to maintain up to date and useful resources for students and staff to utilise.



Mobile Phones

Students must switch off their mobile phones and other electronic devices upon entering school grounds and hand them in to the front office. Devices cannot be switched on until a student has left the school grounds at the end of the day.

P&C - Parents and Citizens' Association

Our membership is always open to all parents and carers of students attending the school and to all citizens.

We are always keen to welcome new members and particularly members who have an interest in the services provided by our P&C like our fundraising activities, school banking program and uniform Shop.

Meetings are held in Week 3 & Week 7 each term on Wednesday evenings starting at 6:00pm. Our annual membership is \$2 and entitles you to be involved in the decision making process within our P&C.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an evidence-based framework that brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe, and supportive learning culture. The framework assists our school to improve social, emotional, behavioural, and academic outcomes for our students.

When PBL is implemented well, teachers and students at Woy Woy Public School have more time to focus on relationships and classroom instruction. Students and staff benefit from:

- reduced inappropriate behaviour
- increased time focused on instruction
- improved social-emotional wellbeing
- positive and respectful relationships among students and staff
- support for teachers to teach, model and respond effectively to student needs
- a predictable learning environment where staff and students know what is expected to deliver effective practices that can be sustained over time.

At Woy Woy Public School, we have developed three core school-wide expectations that form the foundation of our PBL practices. We explicitly teach the positive behaviours that are expected every week and reward those who are demonstrating positive behaviours with 'Yali Tokens'.

PBL Rewards Days!

Everyday teachers give out Yali Tokens to students who are demonstrating 'Being Respectful', 'Being Responsible', and 'Being Engaged' in the classroom and on the playground. Students will collect and accumulate the tokens throughout the term and trade in these vouchers on the school's PBL Rewards Day held at the end of each term. The more tokens collected, the better the prize!

Property

Personal Belongings

Students are responsible for their own clothing and belongings. Staff will assist students to find lost or misplaced items but it is not the responsibility of staff to ensure that items are not lost or misplaced. Parents/carers should label each item of clothing and other belongings clearly. Parents/carers are requested to check belongings regularly and return items to school if they do not belong to their child.

Lost Property

Lost property is located in a grey cupboard outside the hall. Items marked with a student's name are regularly returned to students. Students and parents/carers are encouraged to check for missing property. At the end of each year unclaimed items are donated to charity.

Preschool

Guliyali Preschool is a Department of Education Preschool located within Woy Woy Public School and has been operational since 1977. Guliyali Preschool is one of three 'prior to school' centres located within a primary school on the Central Coast.

Guliyali Preschool operates in line with the NSW Department of Education school centres terms and our daily hours are the same as school hours: 8:50am - 2:50pm.

Guliyali Preschool caters for 40 children per week and is comprised of two groups of 20 children. The children attend on a 5-day fortnight attendance pattern with Wednesday as the alternating day.

Children attend department preschools for one year only, the year before they start Kindergarten. Children must turn four on or before 31 July in the year of attendance.

Reports

- Reports are distributed twice a year (Terms 2 and 4), via the Parent Portal.
- Paper copies may be requested via the office.

SaCC - Schools as Community Centre



Located across the Central Coast at Blue Haven, North Lakes, Wyong, Wyoming and Woy Woy, SaCCs are Community Centres based in a local Public school.

Working in collaboration and partnerships with local agencies they provide a range of activities and groups to engage and support families with children o-8years. Groups are free or at a very low cost and examples have included:

Times to Remember



School Attendance

Regular school attendance and punctuality is compulsory. Students' attitudes towards school attendance are formed in the first few years of school and they should only be allowed to miss school for important reasons.

If your child is unable to attend, you are required to advise us via the Parent Portal or telephone the school indicating the exact period of absence and the reason. If your child is absent due to illness for 3 days or more, a medical certificate will be required. If you know in advance that your child will be away, please contact the office. Travelling for 5 days or more should be organised to coincide with school holidays so that learning is not disrupted. Extended Leave Forms are held in the office to be completed prior to any holidays occurring during term. Please complete for 5 days or more at least 1 week in advance prior to travel, including a copy of your travel itinerary or tickets.

Scripture

NSW public schools offer special religious education and special education in ethics, delivered by approved providers wherever available.

During enrolment, you can choose a special religious education option for your child from the school's available approved providers. You can withdraw your child from special religious education by selecting alternative meaningful activities, or special education in ethics, if it's available.

You can update your preference by writing to the school.

Scripture lessons are scheduled on Wednesday mornings.

Lessons for students in Years 3-6 will be held each Wednesday between 9:00am and 9:30am. Lessons for students in Years K-2 will be held each Wednesday between 9:30am and 10:00am. The options for Special Religious Education (SRE) are as follows:

- 1. Combined Christian scripture (teaches a general Christian message)
- 2. Catholic scripture (follows the teachings of the Catholic faith)
- 3. Non-scripture (for students whose parents don't wish them to attend either of the first two options).

Special Education

Woy Woy Public School has 7 Special Education classes within the mainstream setting – Early Intervention (EI), 2 x Autism (AU), a moderate/severe intellectual class (IO/IS), Mult-categorical (MC), Junior and Senior Intensive Learning Support (Mental Health) and Intensive learning Support (Behaviour) (ED) classes. Placement in these classes is decided at a selection panel through the Department of Education and Communities Tuggerah Office.

Each class has a Teacher and School Learning Support Officer (SLSO) to assist in the classroom.

All students in the support classes work from a Personal Individual Learning Plan (PlaSP), based on ability levels across several domains. Students are integrated into mainstream activities within the school where appropriate.

Sport

- All students are allocated a sporting house at the time of enrolment.
- Students will participate in Sport and Physical education lessons each Friday.
- Students are encouraged to wear appropriate, supportive shoes to participate in these lessons, along with their house coloured polo shirt.
- Additional opportunities to participate in various sports, games and sporting events will be offered to students in Years 3-6 throughout the year.
- Events include sport carnivals, SISA Sport in Schools Australia, rep sport (PSSA), weekly sport, cross country & Year 2 & support class water safety & swim program.

Student Voice Council

Woy Woy Public School has a proud tradition of developing leadership skills across our school. An integral part of this program is the Student Voice Council (SVC.)

The students are chosen by their peers and attend weekly meetings to discuss fundraising, recreation and environment issues that impact our school.

The SRC year is divided into semesters, with two SVC students being elected from each class, at the start of Term 1 and a new committee being elected at the commencement of Term 3.

Each class is represented by two students for each semester. The students are encouraged to be responsible role models and active members of the school community.

Student Safety

School Gates

In the interest of child safety our school gates are locked from 9:10am - 2:30pm. If you need to access the school during this time you need to use the office entrance located in Park Road. All visitors must report to the school office.

Parking

As with most schools, finding a parking space outside our school can be a problem. To avoid placing lives in danger, please find a space so that the pedestrian crossing on Park Road remains a safe place to cross - morning and afternoon. **The School Car Park is for school staff only. Please do not drive into the school grounds.**

Student Health

Sickness and First Aid during School Hours

If a student becomes sick or is injured during the school day they are attended to by the office staff. If required, the office staff will contact parents/carers using one of the contact numbers provided. It is therefore vital that you notify the school of all changes of address, telephone numbers and emergency contacts. Emergency first aid is provided to students in the first aid room located in the main office.



Medication at School

The administering any medications, is organised through the School Office, by parents completing and signing an 'Administer Medication Request' form. All medication is held in the Office and administered to students by staff at the appropriate times. School staff cannot administer medicines without written permission forms having been submitted. Students are not permitted to carry any medication to or from school. All medication is to be handed to our front office by a parent/carer.

Medication for students with chronic conditions like asthma and allergies are also held in the School Office, along with their Action Plans. for use as needed. This includes EpiPens, Ventolin & antihistamine. These medications accompany students when they leave the school grounds for excursions or sport. In the interests of your child's health and safety, if they suffer from any chronic illness, please provide the medication and Action Plan promptly.







These action plans are required if your child has been diagnosed with anaphylaxis, allergies, epilepsy, eczema or asthma.



Student Voice

Student voice in primary schools is essential for fostering an inclusive and engaging learning environment. By encouraging young learners to express their thoughts, ideas, and opinions, schools not only empower students but also enhance their sense of belonging and responsibility. When students participate in decision–making processes, whether it's through class discussions, surveys, or student councils, they develop critical thinking skills and learn the value of collaboration. This active involvement helps educators tailor learning experiences to better meet the needs and interests of their students, ultimately leading to improved educational outcomes and a vibrant school community.
