
School beanies and scarves are available to purchase for winter. Payment can be made via the school office or School Bytes. Please label all clothing, as we have a growing pile of lost property in the office.



Semester 1 Student Academic Reports



This semester, there will be some changes to our school reports so that they align with updated recommendations from the NSW Department of Education. Changes to our Yenda academic reports include:

- -Student goals will no longer be listed and commented on in our reports. However they will be included in a different form, separate to the report.
- -The achievement of a "C" grade is now referred to as "expected" not "sound".
- -Three levels of achievement for student application (high/satisfactory/low).
- -Teacher comments for Years 1-6 will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy.
- -Kindergarten reports will include a comment for all key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology.

Changes have been made to ensure more clarity when reporting to parents. If you have any questions about these changes please contact Mrs Sarah Brown, Mrs Michelle Perez or Mrs Nicholle Callinan.



NSW Public Schools Student Survey







We looked at art works from The Ned Kelly Series by Sidney Nolan and were inspired to paint our Ned Kelly series of Ned at the beach.








Ned Kelly was executed at the Melbourne Gaol in 1880.

Ned Kelly told the schoolmaster from Glenrowan no to dream too loud. Ned Kelly's Dad was also a convict and an outlaw.






Ned Kelly was an infamous bushranger.
