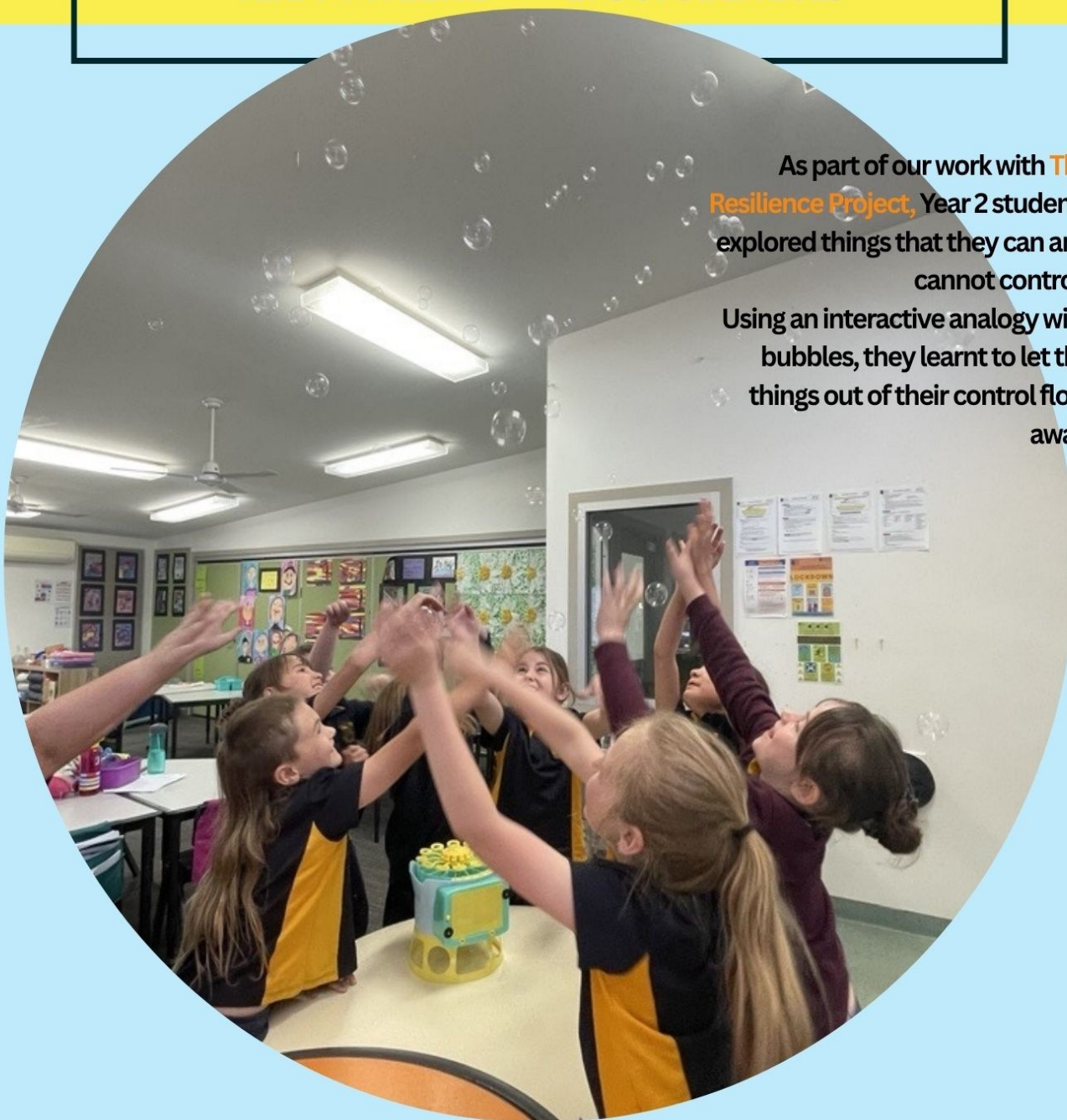




YEOVAL CENTRAL SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

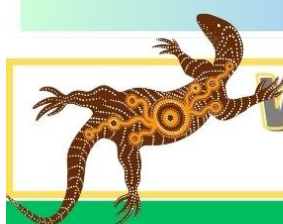
2025 SWIMMING PROGRAMS

Our Little Eagles have swooped back in after the holidays and are stretching their wings with extended mornings from 9am to 12pm.

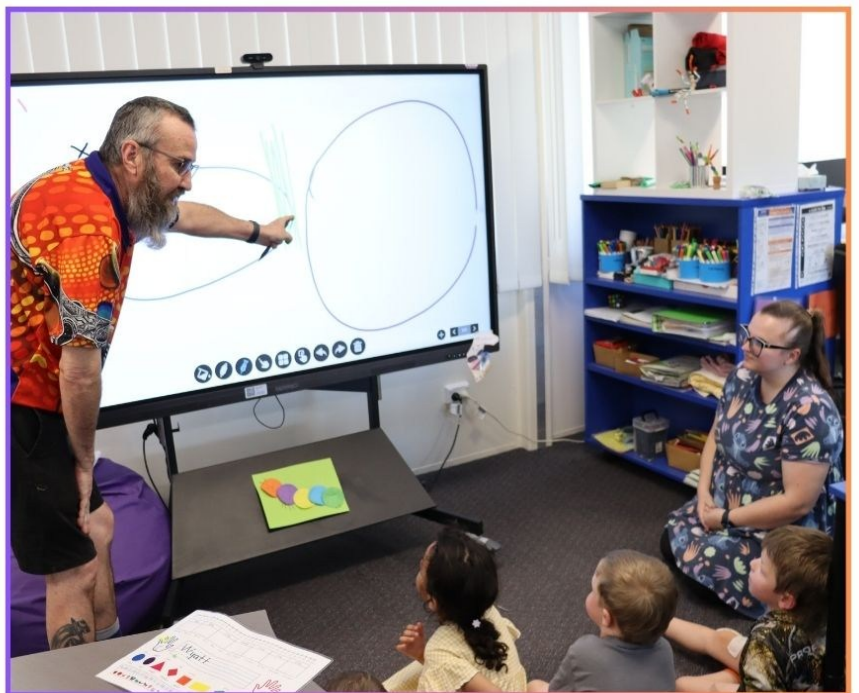
They're now joining us for recess, learning all about how to play safely, share equipment and follow our playground rules just like the big kids!
