High Potential and Gifted Education at Yoogali PS


From the beginning of Term 2, we are excited to announce the beginning of our journey to providing further opportunities for our students to excel in the space of high potential and gifted education (HPGE).

To start our journey, a Microsoft Forms survey will come home to parents via a link which can be completed on a smart phone or computer that will give us further details of your child and their strengths in the domains of HPGE.

These four domains include:

- **Intellectual domain** refers to natural abilities in processing, understanding, reasoning, and the transfer of learning.
- Creative domain refers to natural abilities in imagination, invention and originality.
- **Social-emotional** refers to natural abilities in self-management and relating to and interacting with others.
- Physical domain refers to natural abilities in muscular movement and motor control.

As shown in the graphic below, this survey, as well as activities we complete at school, will guide us in determining the potential of our students, we can then develop processes and programs to support the potential of these students using the environmental and intrapersonal factors. Completion of processes and programs in HPGE gives your child the best opportunity for high performance and to achieve at their highest potential.




Library Term 1





















P&C News
